6. Reports from County Officers

Secretary Report Suzanna Franklin

Archery GB are holding a membership review which will consist of 5 in person meetings and 5 online: more details are available here: [Membership Review: Your Questions Answered](#)

Treasurers Report Gary Harder

The County has a surplus of for the year of £554.44. The accounts are based on the actual income and expenditure during the 2024 financial year - with a summary adjusting for costs outside of 2024.

As far as possible I have allocated costs to the events the County hosts and believe the breakdown regarding those events is a true reflection of those costs.

Comparing 2024 to 2023 overall income is down for the year.

The decrease of nearly £13,000 is predominantly accounted for by Woking running SAW for 2024 (£11,400) and reduction in affiliations (£1700) due to o/s club affiliations and the unfortunate closure of Lintman Archery Club. This is offset by interest on the savings account of £1000 and hire of the County scoring system £1250.

Comparing 2024 to 2023 overall expense is down for the year. The decrease of nearly £10,000 is predominantly down to SAW. Other significant expenditure reduction in equipment costs (£600), donations/grants (£1,200) and SCAS affiliations (£600) are offset by an increase in Coaching £1,500 and Intercounty matches £1,100 (both of which it is good to see).

A summary of the County funded shoots.

Spring/Autumn Longbow £32 surplus.

Clout £99 surplus

Field £327 deficit

SAW had an extraordinary surplus £175 due to the release of funds held in the Stripe account post the cancellation of the 2020 event.

However, it is the last time so if anyone would like to volunteer to check next years account please contact me as I would be very grateful.

At the meeting:

Their support was crucial to the success of the events. Dates for the 2025 events will be updated on the Website shortly and I will look at ways to publicise the events more to try and encourage greater participation this year.

Outdoor Target Richard FitzGerald

2024: Sunday 19th May World Record Status WA1440 @ Guildford Archery Club 70 archers attended this year, Approx 55% were Surrey Archers.

An enjoyable day was had by all, staying dry with a moderate breeze, typical conditions for shooting at Guildford.

We used the IANSEO Pro scoring system including the PDA's from CSAA with the help of Adrian Murnaghan showing us the ropes.

Many thanks to our Judging team of Steve Vallis, Andrew Trimble and Ben Hastings.

2025 Surrey Champs will be back at Guildford on Sunday 15th June. WRS WA1440 for Surrey and visitor archers. This year will be combined with the Surrey vs Bucks intercounty match.

Guildford also running our first WRS 720 and Head to Head on Saturday 14th June. Combined weekend ticket for £30 – now on Sale.

Surrey Archery Weekend Helen & Mark Piper *Candy Schofield, Mark Preston*

SAW 2024 was held at Woking Archery Club (WAC) due to the problems with Tenzone rented Target supply. The shoot was restricted to 38 targets with Recurve on Saturday and Compound & Barebow on Sunday. Nevertheless more Archers attended over the 2 days than at the usual venue, Tolworth, in 2023. WAC made a surplus on the shoot and as a recognition for the help from a good number of hard working Surrey Volunteers, and the use of Surrey equipment at JAS and SAW, the club made a £500 donation to the county.

SAW 2025 will again be held at WAC because of the success of SAW24 and because setup is much easier as the Surrey equipment is stored at WAC's field. It is again a National Tour leg.

Volunteers, Judges and Loos are already arranged for the weekend of 17th-18th May, an earlier date than usual due to International competition timings.

The Organising committee of Helen & Mark Piper, Candy Schofield and Mark Preston are willing to continue to stand as SAW organisers at the 2025 AGM.

Records Officer Barbara Wanzenried

We had an eventful year on the RO and Selection Committee side in 2024.

After a hiatus following Covid and AGB's new age and classification scheme we were able to publish County rankings again in 2024. While participation was still fairly low it will hopefully encourage more archers to participate. All that is required is making sure that the relevant rounds are submitted to their RO who will in turn send them to me.

Surrey has also been able to agree a Friendly with Buckinghamshire at their County Chamsp which allowed 15 Surrey archers to represent their County (all of whom will be receiving a year bars and county brooches if it was their first time). The Friendly will be held again in 2025 and will take place at the Surrey County Champs in Guildford in June. Any archer interested in participating should ensure that their RO has the relevant rounds as early as possible.

Surrey was also represented at the National Team Event in Lilleshall, with a Women's and a Men's Recurve Team. The Women's Recurve Team won the bronze medal, and the Men achieved a credible 6th place. Unfortunately, the Women's Compound Team suffered from last minute withdrawals and only one member was able to shoot.

Surrey had entered the SCAS Portsmouth League, where the Juniors won Bronze and Surrey placed 4th or

5th in all the other categories, a great improvement from previous years. The Portsmouth League has changed format slightly this year, but entries are flooding in, thank you! To date the Surrey Recurve Team is in the lead!

Following the introduction of the 50+ category there was some confusion / discussion with regards to UK and County records. AGB have now updated their Rules of Shooting (and published on their website in January). 50+ archers will be pleased to know that there are now further 50+ County Records to be achieved. Your RO has all the necessary information.

County Coaching Organiser Bill Lanham-Brown

Coaches in Surrey.

Running a report from Sport 80 for coaches in Surrey, we have 64.

Coaching Courses.

Surrey facilitated a Session and a Development Coach course, last year. Both were well attended. It is possible that we will do the same again this year. If so, I will let you all know when and where.

Coaching Renewals.

Coaches, please remember that you need to have a current DBS and that your safeguarding is up to date, when you apply for renewal, without these you will not be renewed.

Archery Development.

We have taken our development coaching team to a couple of clubs this year. These sessions were well received and those taking part enjoyed them and gain valuable insight into how they were shooting. If you would like to have us, come to your club and work with your members / coaches, please email me.

Archery Development Sessions

We are about to start the first of seven sessions for archers. The session will be run by the Surrey Coaching Team. These are intended to provide help, guidance, understanding and an insight into how the archers perform. These morning and afternoon sessions are each limited to 8 archers. As of today 11-01-25, we are full. As a Surrey archer, you should have been made aware of these sessions as this was emailed out to all members, if you would like more information, please contact me.

That's it for now; if you need any help with coaching or getting coaching at your club, please contact me and if I can help I will.

At the meeting:

This is something we would like to take up again in Autumn/Early winter 2025.

Team Manager Steve Patterson

Due to no activity from the county teams after the summer period, this is my only report. I would just like to add my thanks to that of the selection committee Chair to all those who took part in the two events we attended.

Although we did get a few invites from other archery associations, we could only field archers for a match with Berkshire and the National Team Championships at Lilleshall. This was due to archers not submitting the correct criteria for selection. We have the county records officer to thank for the teams we did submit.

Buckinghamshire: a friendly shoot on a very warm sunny day, sharing the disciplines two all. Recurve and Longbow going to Surrey and Compound and barebow going to Buckinghamshire. (Only just)

My thanks to Buckinghamshire for their friendly and welcoming manner and the hope of more competition in the future.

The team event at Lilleshall was managed by my deputy Barbara W. As I was unable to attend. All participants performing really well over the two days.

Team shirts will be given to archers representing Surrey at Inter-County competitions. If archers require a

back up shirt then they will be required to purchase at full cost.

Postal League Andy Taylor

I took over as Postal League organizer at the end of September last year. I'd had feedback that clubs would generally prefer to know who their opponents were from the start of the season, and my original plan was to base the leagues on scores from last year. Unfortunately I only had scores for November and December, so set up the leagues on those. Having sent out the draft, I had some requests to adjust target scores and to add extra teams, and also Guildford agreed to rejoin this year with a couple of teams. The final league listing and fixtures list was sent out at the end of October ahead of the start of the winter competition, and several clubs responded positively to this. We ended up with 36 Recurve teams, 17 barebow, 12 Compound, 18 Longbow and 5 Junior Recurve, from 15 clubs. Everyone got their scores in for November and December, and there are only a couple of clubs still to submit for January. There were very few teams that didn't get a score in, and that seems to be more due to the rather bad weather we've been having, seasonal flu etc, rather than lack of interest. Compound archers seem to suffer more with the bad weather, and two out of the 5 junior teams haven't submitted any scores so far – they obviously don't like cold and wet! For next season I'd plan to base the initial leagues out based on this year's scores and to get the initial draft leagues out earlier to allow people to review it and change estimated scores in case some archers have left or joined etc.

Safeguarding Officer Suzanna Franklin

Pretty much the same report as last year, sorry.

Archery GB have continued to give information on safeguarding courses through a couple of different suppliers. On Sport80 they do seem to only have a limited amount from UK Coaching but if you go onto the UK Coaching website there are plenty available.

Certificates are required to be uploaded to your Sport80 account, if you have any issue doing this then please contact AGB with a copy of the certificate and they will upload it for you.

Remember it is a requirement of renewing your coaching license (a face to face is required every 6 years) plus all Club Safeguarding/Welfare Officers are required to be up to date too.

If your club Safeguarding/Welfare Officer is not up to date with the required safeguarding courses or DBS then please ask them to complete ASAP. The DBS if FOC and the basic safeguarding is free too (about 4 hours online). Other safeguarding is around £35 which lasts for 3 year.

In 2024 Archery GB was in the situation of closing club access to members if the club did not have an up to date Safeguarding/Welfare Officer and not letting them open to members until the Safeguarding/Welfare Officer was up to date with requirements. To stop this to happening to any Surrey clubs please ensure that your club abides to AGB Safeguarding stipulations.

From Archery GB July 2024:

Archery GB is committed to creating and maintaining a safe and positive environment, and we accept our responsibility to protect all Members involved in Archery. It is policy for a club who affiliates to Archery GB to have a Club Welfare / Safeguarding Officer in place, and that this individual is trained and fully understands what is expected of the role, i.e. current vetting check carried out through Archery GB and current safeguarding training evidenced on their profile, within our Membership System, before they are permitted to carry out the role.

The Archery GB Safeguarding Team have recently been focusing on the status of Club Welfare /Safeguarding Officers at clubs across the sport, to ensure that clubs are complying with the Archery GB Safeguarding Policy and Club Affiliation minimum requirements around Club Officials.

From the 26 June 2024 onwards, clubs without a welfare officer or clubs with a welfare officer but without training or a vetting check, have / will receive a letter from Archery GB informing them that they do not currently meet these requirements based on the information we hold in our Membership Portal. We are advising these clubs to reach out to the Safeguarding Team, Regional Development Officers, and their County / Regional Officials for support to ensure that they can meet these requirements or show progression to meeting them by 1st August 2024.

Failure to meet these requirements or show positive steps working towards meeting them will mean that all activities at their club will be suspended until such a time that a Welfare / Safeguarding Officer is in place with the appropriate training and vetting check completed.

There are currently 6 clubs in Surrey as at 12/01/25 who could be potentially be in this position due to a lack of either no Safeguarding training certificate uploaded onto Sport80 or not holding a DBS, some of these club Safeguarding Officer/Welfare Officer hold neither. This is a mandatory requirement and while we appreciate that it takes time for a new person to gain the training and DBS, please ensure it is completed ASAP. 4 clubs do not have their Safeguarding/Welfare Officer named.

The Safeguarding/Welfare Officer and Chairperson are crucial roles in safeguarding and being able to identify who they are for every club and organisation is vital when dealing with serious safeguarding concerns.

When the police and/or social services contact Archery GB regarding a safeguarding concern, we must be able to contact the club Welfare Officer and Chairperson as swiftly as possible. Unfortunately, there have been instances when the police have been unable to locate a Welfare Officer or Chairperson from information provided on the club website and indeed Archery GB's safeguarding team have had difficulty identifying these people because their roles are not shown on the club Sport:80 profile.

Safeguarding training is mandatory for Safeguarding/Welfare Officers because it provides the knowledge and awareness to be able to deal with risks and concerns effectively. It cannot be underestimated how important training is for someone carrying out this role.



Archery Welfare Officer training

Safeguarding training is mandatory for this role because it is not only essential in being able to fulfil the role, but it also provides the person responsible for safeguarding the confidence and skills to be able to deal with worries and concerns and respond appropriately. Safeguarding legislation and government guidance changes rapidly, therefore training should be renewed every 3 years.

Firstly, basic training should be completed and must consist of a tutor led course which usually lasts 3 hours and can be done either face-to-face or online. Following basic training, a specialist training workshop for safeguarding roles in a sports setting should be completed.
